"College was supposed to be a fresh start for our son Ethan, but instead, it quickly turned into a struggle. Despite having an official diagnosis of ADHD and Dyslexia, the support he received at Belmont was inconsistent at best. Professors didn't always follow through on accommodations, and the disability office was slow to respond when issues came up. Ethan felt overlooked, and we could see his confidence slipping."

"Dr. Terrell and SmartTrack changed everything. From the first conversation, it was clear he understood the

system—and more importantly, how to work *within* it to get real results. He personally reached out to Belmont's disability services, coached Ethan on self-advocacy, and helped streamline communication with his instructors. He also worked one-on-one with Ethan to develop personalized strategies for managing ADHD: breaking assignments into steps, using tools to stay organized, and preparing for high-stress situations like presentations."

"By sophomore year, Ethan's GPA had jumped, and for the first time, he started believing he could actually thrive—not just survive. He's now in his junior year, thriving in the Music Industry Studies program, interning with a local recording studio, and taking ownership of his path.
